

Walts gut



The up-ing and down-ing of the spinnaker sail is eased hopefully by having a "Slooper Bag". Its function is tangle prevention to increase rate of sail setting, retrieval and stowage. "A" should not tilt and be which fastens sturdily to the hull fittings. The "C" section is a smooth, slightly tapering cloth tube.

The "B" end needs a tie to a special fastener handy to the crew. The sail gets a dependable light line from its center through the Slooper Bag to the crew position. There should be a reinforcement cloth sewed on with zig-zag polyester thread: this is the shape I made for the sail: the "D" rectangle is about four by five inches. The holes in my patch admit fingers and line, and patch is large enough to spread the tugging and not rip or distort the sail overmuch.

Seams in the tube must be made smooth-side-<u>IN</u> and the tube should be so shaped as not to collapse. Our Slooper Bag is six feet long. Our wide-end-forward is 6 inches in diameter. Our small-end-amidships is four inches in diameter. Our reinforcement collar is about six inches deep.
